
NEST VERTICALS

As per the new structure, Nest focuses on three main verticals; (i) Action Research, (ii) Education and (iii) Community Development.






Nest members celebrating its completion of 3 years as a registered body in its Rising Day 11th October 2021

NEST ACTIVITIES 2021-2022

ACTION RESEARCH

1. Mental Health - Lamka Suicide Survey Report

Since 2017, Nest has engaged in Suicide Survey of Lamka Town, Churachandpur District, Manipur, through which, it has collected data on incidences of suicide deaths in the town, and partly covering Churachandpur District since 2014.



The suicide data collected as of today spans across eight years, a total of 144 cases of suicides have been found within the study population of roughly 1 Lacs. In the year 2021, a total of 23 suicide cases have occurred in Lamka town and parts of Churachandpur District.


As per the data collected by Nest, the year wise frequency of suicide can be presented at 1.91 cases per month in 2021, and 1.5 per month in the past 8 years (2014-2021).

The year wise data can be presented as below:

As per the data, it can be seen that the rate of suicide has remained above ten cases every year in a population of roughly 1 lakh. The year 2020 has by far been the lowest with 12 cases on record. It may be noted that Mental Health and especially the case of



suicide is still considered a taboo in the Lamka community. As such, there are cases which are concealed from the public.

As an Action Research, the following Action oriented activities have been carried out:

(a) Nest Mental Health Action


In an attempt to help reduce the number of Suicide rates within the District, Nest has initiated Mental Health Action Plan. Under this project, Nest arranged Counselling sessions for identified suicide survivors as they are prone to attempting it again in the future. As of March 2022, Counselling sessions have been arranged for 1 survivor at individual and family level.

(b) Mental Health Practitioners Network

A network of Mental Health Practitioners from the District was set to be formed in 2023. This network will help take effective actions in a more efficient and timely manner.

(c) Mental Health Practitioners Directory

A Directory that comprised of the names of practicing Counsellors, their services and the ways and means to connect with them was published and launched by Dr. Kim Simte, CMO Churachandpur during the District Youth Outreach and Consultation on SDG Program on 26th March 2022. A total of 22 Counsellors including Organisations providing Counselling services in the District were included in the Directory. The objective of this publication is to make help accessible and break stigmas and normalize help seeking among the public and in turn result in lesser suicide rate in the District.



Other Research Projects:

1. A Research Project titled "Mental State and Readiness to change among the inmates of LRRC" that aims to study the Mental State and the Readiness to change among drug users in Lamka was carried out at Lamka Rehabilitation and Research Centre (LRRC). Nest interns from Martin Luther Christian University, Shillong, namely Victor Kammuonlal, Cliff Ngurthanlien, Arvan R Marak and Kedocavi Meyase helped in data collection and The overall compilation and report writing. analysis was done by Nest Research Partner Miss Rachel Chingnunhoih. The Research Report was published and presented on February 7, 2022 at LRRC.

2. IIT-R Research Project

Nest is currently engaged in a Research Project under Dr. Roluahpuia, Assistant Professor, Indian Institute of Technology, Roorke. The Project titled "Economic Transformation and Upland Livelihood in Eastern Himalayas" tries to understand the changing pattern, the causes and challenges of the agricultural system in Eastern Himalayas particularly in the states of Manipur and Mizoram.

Handling the Manipur field, Nest has carried out research field work in Lamzang and Geljang villages of Churachandpur sub-division, Churachandpur District of Manipur, where commercial farming, development projects and transformation of livelihood has widely taken place.

3. A Market Research was conducted on the Status on Entrepreneurship in Lamka under the Taima Opportunity Foundation. Under the project, 100 Lamka based entrepreneurs were interviewed for this project.

NEST COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT INITIATIVES

SDG CAMPAIGNS

Nest has had the opportunity to partner with the National Foundation for India (NFI) in working towards strengthening and localising the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals under the project "Leaving No One Behind: Building Pathways for Peace", a project funded by the European Union.

Through this project, popularisation and awareness on the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) has been carried out through awareness campaigns, Focus Group Discussions, District Level and State Level Consultative meeting on SDGs -

1. FGD on SDG 8 & 16

A Focus Group Discussion (FGD) on SDG No. 8 (Decent Work and Economic Growth) and SDG No. 16 (Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions) was conducted on 30th September 2021 at SososCafé, Elimveng, New Lamka, Churachandpur.



NFI Field Coordinator for Tn the event, Churachandpur District Mr. Jamkhanpau introduced the Project to the gathering attendees and Resource Person Mr. T Gouminlal talked about the Sustainable Development Goals with special reference to SDG No. 8 and SDG No. 16. Also NangmuansangLethil Resource Person Mr. discussedFinancial Investment scope and opportunities with a group of youths to deliberate on the importance of proper economic planning for economic sustainability.

The gathering attendees also brainstormed on possible activities that could be carried out in the future to strengthen the SDG in the District.

The event was organised in collaboration with the Zomi Youth Association Mata Mualtam Village Unit and Mental Health Awareness was campaigned through Mental Health Counsellors — Miss Nemy Tombing Counsellor Rayburn High and Miss Biakhoih spoke as resource persons at the event.

3. Interaction on Mental Health Awareness and Challenges with Lamka Rehabilitation and Research Centre (LRRC)

An outreach program was organised at a rehab centre called the Lamka Rehabilitation and Research Centre (LRRC) on 30thNovembe 2021. The program facilitated by Resource Persons Miss Rachel Chinghoih and Miss Sophia Goumawi was engaged in an interactive manner where issues surrounding Mental Health and substance abuse. Student interns of Nest from Martin Luther Christian University, Shillong also presented a report of their study on the relation of Mental Health a substance abuse.

4. Youth Outreach Program— Theme: Mental Health Awareness Goal 3

A youth outreach program was jointly organised by the Field Coordinator, NFI Churachandpur in collaboration with the Nghathal Baptist Youth Fellowship, Evangelical Baptist Convention Church and Nest on 27th February 2022 at Penial Hall, Muolvaiphei, Churachandpur, Manipur.

The program was a combination of a church outreach fellowship and mental health awareness delivered by the National Foundation for India.

Resource Persons Miss Rachel Chinghoih and Miss Sophia Goumawi talked about the importance of Mental Well-being and presented the different types of Mental Illness that are prevalent in the District. They also discussed on how to identify Mental Illness and how to take actions when needed.

5. District Youth Outreach and Consultation on SDG:
Theme- Mental Health Prevalence, Drawbacks and
Steps



A district level youth outreach and consultation was organised at Churachandpur on 26th March 2022 at Central Mini Auditorium Hebron Veng, New Lamka Churachandpur Manipur. The event was focused on building awareness around the SDGs with special focus on Goal 3: Good Health and Wellbeing. A

network of Mental Health Caregivers was launched by Dr. Kim Simte, Chief Medical Officer (CMO), Churachandpur District, through a directory of Mental Health Practitioners from Churachandpur district compiled by Nest.

The event was divided into two sessions. The first session saw the launch of Mental Health Practitioners Directory and knowledge sharing on



the Sustainable Development Goals with special reference to Churachandpur District and SDG No. 3 Good Health and well-being from Resource Persons CCI Mr. Pauzagin Director and Mr. KhualpuTungnung. A presentation on "An overview of Lamka Suicide Survey" was also presented by Miss Rachel Chinghoih. The Second Session was organised in an interactive manner where the Participants mainly Mental Healthcare givers discussed on Mental Health-Prevalence, challenges and Drawbacks. The discussion was facilitated by Miss Chingbiakhoih.

6. Pupa Laam Tual Sai



Nest in partnership with the Lamka Young Leaders Forum organised a cultural meet on younger and older generations. 7. Clean India Campaign

On 12 October 2021, Nest participated in the Nation Wide Clean India jointly organised by Vision Lamka, District Administration, ADC Churachandpur, 113 Bn BSF, NYK which started at 7:00 AM from Bus Station till Nute Bazar, Central Lamka, Lamka town, Churachandpur District, Manipur.

The market area was newly opened after a long closure due to Covid 19, and the cleanliness drive was initiated to ensure clean and safe market place for Lamka.





NEST EDUCATION INITIATIVE

Nest believes that education is the key foundation to sustainable development. For a community to be sustainable and developed, it is crucially important to inculcate the right values, ethics and morals amongst the younger generations.

To achieve these goals, education is the most fundamental tool and it is of utmost importance to strengthen the delivery of Quality Education amongst all sections of the society.

The cost of education has been constantly increasing over the years, and the question of affordability and accessibility has become a growing concern. With this, the role of free and affordable education has become even more critical. As such, Nest has found it imperative to initiate an intervention in the field of education, focusing on the most marginalised sections of the society.

An early education project has been conceptualised with special focus on "Students" attending Government run Institutions. This education project is currently at concept level, and preparation is focussed for execution in the next financial year 2023-2024.

The project is currently focussed on three activity based intervention.

- i. Psycho-social support through joyful learning activities, arts and crafts,
- ii. Science and Maths practical learning sessions through joyful learning.
- iii. Communication and Leadership building through Storytelling, personality development and joyful learning activities.
